A Moment in Time: John Mullins' Journey in 1960s The Republic of Congo as told by John Mullins



In a remote corner of Africa, there exists a moment in time that forever changed the life of John Mullins. It was the 1960s when he ventured to the Republic of Congo with the promise of a good income, ready to work for months in a land unknown to him. Little did he know, this journey would be a test of his character and an awakening to the harsh realities of life in a nation undergoing profound political and social changes.

John's time in 1960s Congo was marked by hardship and

disappointment. Despite dedicating himself to his work, he never received the payment he was promised. But sometimes, life has a way of steering us in unexpected directions. When he was called back home because his visa to move to Australia had been approved, he saw it as a blessing. The poverty and upheaval he witnessed in the Republic of Congo weighed heavily on him, yet he left with a heart full of compassion and a deep sense of gratitude for the opportunities that awaited him.

Amidst the challenging circumstances of the 1960s, one memory stands out: John driving through the Congolese landscape in a simple, open truck covered with tarps. He couldn't help but notice the Congolese children along the road, reaching up with their tiny hands, their eyes filled with hope. It was a gesture of innocence and resilience that touched his heart. In those moments, John found solace in offering them small candies, a simple act of kindness that brought a glimmer of joy to both the children and himself. His time in 1960s Congo might not have unfolded as he initially envisioned, but it left him with a lasting appreciation for the simple joys in life and a renewed belief in the power of human connection amidst adversity.

In the 1980s, Kalamunda was a hub of artistic expression, and one of its standout figures was Truda Austen. Her residency at The Jack Healey Centre and her role as an art teacher at the Learning Centre made her an integral part of the local art community. Truda's influence extended beyond her teaching, as she was also involved in the creation of the magnificent stained glass window at the Kalamunda Library, a true gem that stands as the largest stained glass window in the southern hemisphere. However, today, there is a mission underway to rediscover some of Truda's locally known artworks, pieces that once vividly conveyed the stories of our local community members. If you were a part of the local council or a resident during this transformative era and might know the present whereabouts of these pieces, we invite you to share your knowledge and contribute to this fascinating quest.

Truda Austen was more than just an artist; she was a storyteller, capturing the essence of people through her art. The name of the project was 'Then & Now'. There is a reference book held at the library archives written by Evelyn Halley. Some of Truda's works have, unfortunately, faded into obscurity with the passage of time. Yet, they are vital pieces of Kalamunda's history and serve as a living testament to the stories and memories of our community. The search for these missing artworks is not merely about rediscovering art; it's about



reconnecting with our town's rich history. We call upon all members, whether you have firsthand knowledge or are inspired to join the quest, to help unearth these hidden treasures. Let's celebrate the art and history that define our beloved Kalamunda.
